



**M. Keith Rawlings, MD** brings over 35 years of HIV clinical, research, and administrative experience to his new role as Co-Chair of the Infectious Disease/HIV program of the National Medical Association (NMA).

**Experience:** Most recently Dr. Rawlings served as Senior Medical Director for North American Medical Affairs, at ViiV Healthcare providing scientific and medical expertise for sponsored clinical trials, cohort and epidemiologic research along with education for healthcare providers and consumers domestically and internationally. Prior to joining ViiV Healthcare, Dr. Rawlings was Director, HIV Medical Sciences at Gilead Sciences, where he oversaw education and training on HIV prevention. He was also part of the team that managed the regulatory submission, approval, and implementation of Truvada<sup>®</sup> for pre-exposure prophylaxis in the U.S. While in practice in Dallas Texas Dr. Rawlings was the Medical Director and Director of Clinical Research at AIDS Arms Inc as well as the Site Leader for the AIDS Clinical Trials Group (ACTG) and Principal Investigator.

Dr. Rawlings is a former Chair, Internal Medicine Section and Co-Chair of the NMA Infectious Diseases/HIV program. Other notable accomplishments include being a member of: the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) AIDS Advisory Committee; the Board of Directors of the American Academy of HIV Medicine; the CDC/PrEP Guidelines - External Working Group on Clinical Guidelines, and the South African Presidential HIV Advisory Board. Dr. Rawlings was Co-Principal Investigator and Advisory Board member of the National Minority AIDS Education and Training Center. He has published over 100 abstracts, articles, and manuscripts. He also co-edited *HIV/AIDS in U.S. Communities of Color*, one of the few books which addressed the HIV epidemic among minorities in the U.S.
